

If you develop website for Apple iPhone™ or Apple iPod Touch™ or an Apple iPad™, you might want the user to be redirected to another page.

The version of Safari Web Browser used by the Apple iPod Touch™ is the same as the version used by the Apple iPhone™ or an Apple iPad™, but carries a different user agent string.

iPod Touch user agent: Mozilla/5.0 (iPod; U; CPU like Mac OS X; en) AppleWebKit/420.1 (KHTML, like Gecko) Version/3.0 Mobile/3A101a Safari/419.3 iPhone user agent: Mozilla/5.0 (iPhone; U; CPU like Mac OS X; en) AppleWebKit/420 (KHTML, like Gecko) Version/3.0 Mobile/1C28 Safari/419.3 iPad user agent: Mozilla/5.0 (iPad; U; CPU OS 3_2 like Mac OS X; en-us) AppleWebKit/531.21.10 (KHTML, like Gecko) Version/4.0.4 Mobile/7B334b Safari/531.21.10

Here's the JavaScript code you need to use in your landing page:

```
if(navigator.userAgent.match(/iPhone/i) || navigator.userAgent.match(/iPod/i)) {  
    // some code  
    window.location = "/iphone.html";  
}  
  
if(navigator.userAgent.match(/iPad/i)) {  
    // some code  
    window.location = "/ipad.html";  
}
```

In the file iphone.html or ipad.html (filename from the JavaScript above), you will need to put the following:

```
<meta name="viewport" content="width=device-width, user-scalable=no" />
```

or

```
<meta name="viewport" content="width=320; initial-scale=1.0; maximum-scale=1.0; user-scalable=0;" />
```
